The Adult Support Team covers:

- Adult modular training leading to the award of the Woodbadge
- First Aid training
- Safeguarding and associated training
- Scout Active Support Units
- Special Needs

The aim of the team is to share and increase the knowledge and skills of all adults within the County. We all, whatever our role, have something to contribute to this objective.

There are a wide range of roles, available to any applicants, within the Adult Support team. Whatever your experience and however much time you have to offer there is a role for you.

Many roles could be carried out by adults with other roles in Scouting – you don't need to give up a local role you love to help support other adults in the County. But if you fancy a change or a new challenge we can also offer this.

The County team is open to all – you do not necessarily need vast prior experience.

Taking on a County role does not mean you have to give up your local role which you enjoy.

SPECIAL NEEDS

Cluster Advisers:

Help support access to Scouting for young people and adults with special needs in a cluster of three or four Districts local to you.

- Advise Scout Groups how to make adjustments to accommodate special needs
- Provide general training to Groups and Districts on special needs themes.
- Advise Explorer Scout Leaders (Young Leaders) on 'Special People' module of the Young Leader's scheme.
- Visit Groups to observe and advise on any difficulties they may be having with individual young people and support their work with the young person's family.

If you have a background in education or a related field and have some professional training in this area please consider this important role.

In particular someone to develop, manage and support our provision of the 'Section Leader Training' aspect of the training scheme [purple modules 11 to 19].

Vast experience in Scouting is **not** necessary, although you will have already completed your first Woodbadge. If you are enthusiastic about Scouting, and enjoy communicating with others please consider joining the friendly and approachable team.

Training of other leaders is fun and can be very rewarding particularly helping to pass on skills to the next generation of leaders. If you are passionate about Scouting, do consider it whatever your past experience.

First Aid Trainers

All leaders in the County need to complete a minimum of First Response training and renew every three years. With about 3000 adults in the County that is a lot of training!

To meet this demand we need a team of First Aid trainers to deliver module 10 – First Response.

You may already be a qualified First Aid trainer but if not you just need a full (course lasting 16hrs or more) First Aid certificate and to be comfortable presenting to adults. We will provide the necessary presenting training to qualify you as a First Response trainer.

With a big team this should not be an onerous task and you will be based in your local area, helping to train your colleagues. Please do consider this vital role in ensuring we share the skills necessary for the welfare of all our members.

Whatever your experience and however much time you have to commit there is a role for you.

Presenters

This role is vital in delivering quality adult training to Hertfordshire's most precious resource, our fantastic leaders.

Whatever your interest in Scouting there is a module that reflects this from Programme to Administration, from Practical Skills to Working with Adults.

- If you have completed your training, have particular interest and are confident presenting to a group of adults why not join our friendly team?
- Since most modules are only a couple of hours long you can offer as much or as little time as you like.
- All the resources you need are available in County. We are looking for both section leaders and managers to contribute their expertise.
- No formal qualifications are needed, but we would help to train you if necessary in the trainer's presenting and facilitating modules.

Also needed are presenters willing to deliver the new Safeguarding courses. This does require some preparatory training.
