UPCOMING INTERNATIONAL DATES/FESTIVALS

- ♦ **2017: UN Year for Sustainable Tourism**
- ♦ **28th January– 15th February: Chinese New Year.** 2017 is the year of the Rooster. Those born in this year are said to be punctual, independent and humorous. Celebrations end with the Lantern Festival, marked with lantern parades, while traditional foods such as Tangyuan are eaten. London will host a range of Holi-themed events around this time, **otherwise 'Colour Runs' are held throughout the year.**

- ♦ **16th April: Easter Sunday**

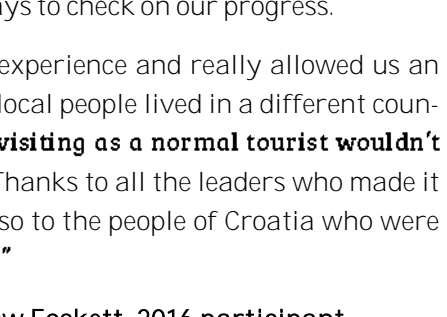
News from the County

The summer of 2016 was a busy year for international activities in Hertfordshire. Expedition locations included Swaziland and Croatia, which you can read more about below.

SWAZILAND 2016

"Once again, Hertfordshire scouts led an expedition to Swaziland in the recent summer. We continued our partnership project, the building of a community centre in Malibeni on a site we had cleared in 2014. It's not all hard work; but it is all great fun! The expedition began with a trip to Kruger National Park in South Africa, where we spent two days on safari and relaxing after the long flight. Whilst working on the project in the following weeks, we stayed with Gogo Khoza, the grandmother of one of the Swazi Rover Scouts we work with. Her homestead is the perfect place to experience Swaziland with chickens clucking around your feet and real family life going on. The expedition ended with a few days of relaxation and fun including a wonderful day of white water rafting and abseiling, as well as a short stay in a hotel. Another expedition will be going ahead in the summer of 2018, so come and join the team and have an experience that you will treasure forever."

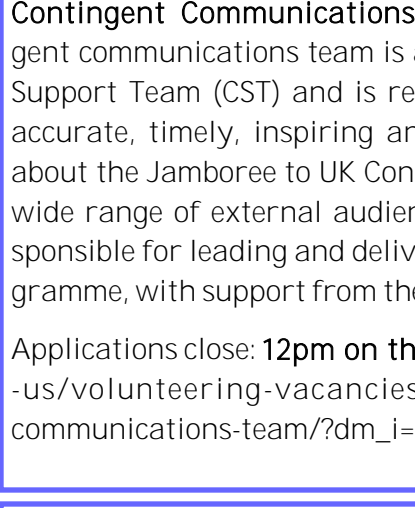
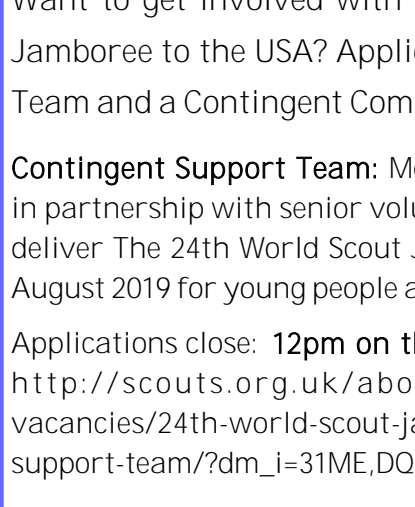
EXPLORER BELT 2016

The Explorer Belt is an award for Explorers and Network aged 16-25.

"This summer several small teams of Explorers and Network from across the county went on an Explorer Belt Expedition to Croatia. On route to Croatia we spent a day in Zurich before getting a sleeper train to Ljubljana and then a coach to Zagreb – Croatia's capital. From there each of the groups went their separate ways as we explored the country on routes we had planned ourselves. Each group achieved 10 smaller projects as well as a main challenge which we worked towards throughout the expedition. These projects varied from trying items of local cuisine to talking to local people about Croatian history and meeting local scouts. Two teams of leaders supervised the groups in country, meeting up with us every few days to check on our progress.

It was a great experience and really allowed us an insight to how local people lived in a different country which just visiting as a normal tourist wouldn't have allowed. Thanks to all the leaders who made it possible and also to the people of Croatia who were really friendly!"

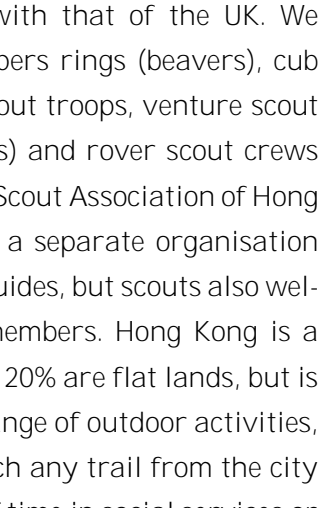


24th WORLD SCOUT JAMBOREE NEEDS YOU!

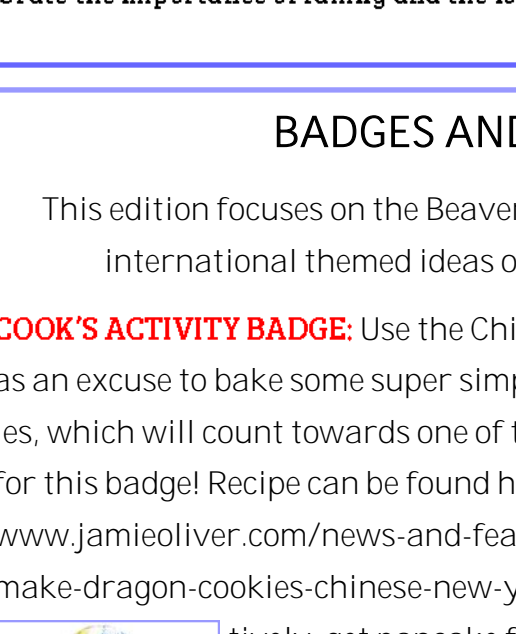

A Look at the Wider World:

Douglas Lau, a scout from Hong Kong currently studying at Durham University, writes about his experiences as a scout and how he celebrates Chinese New Year.



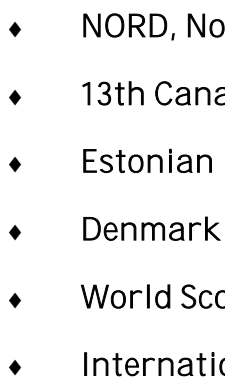
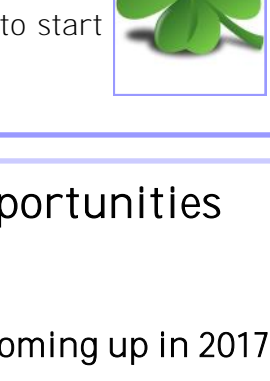
"Scouting in Hong Kong has a very similar structure with that of the UK. We have grasshoppers rings (beavers), cub scout packs, scout troops, venture scout units (explorers) and rover scout crews (network). The Scout Association of Hong Kong is run as a separate organisation from the Girl Guides, but scouts also welcome female members. Hong Kong is a tiny city, smaller than Greater London, and only less than 20% are flat lands, but is home to nearly 100,000 scouts. We participate in a wide range of outdoor activities, in which hiking is the most popular one since we can reach any trail from the city centre in less than 30 minutes. Moreover, we put in a lot of time in social services or environmental projects. It is easy to consider that what we are doing is rather old-fashioned, but we are proud to maintain some of the best practises and values, which is serving our society and educating young people.

Stepping into 2017, it's the year of the Rooster. Chinese New Year is arguably one of the most important celebrations of my culture. It's the occasion where the whole family gathers under one roof, and quite possibly, the only time of the year that you will see the son of the sister of the husband of the sister of your father! Fun fact, each member of the family tree has their title. Therefore you will never mix up which aunts or uncles or cousins are which. Traditionally, the celebration begins two days before New Year's Day; every family member participates in cleaning the house from top to bottom and making sure everything is spotless before New Year's day. There are also numerous rather weird and superstitious practices, for example, you are not supposed to wash your hair or sweep the floor after New Year's Day in order to keep the luck inside your house. One tradition that I believe many won't reject is receiving red packets from the elderly. Parents and grandparents will give out some money contained in a red envelope to their children as a blessing. In return, the children will wish them good luck, good health and good fortune (yes, we all love money). Chinese New Year is pretty much like Christmas, where we celebrate the importance of family and the love for each other."

INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITY BADGE: Learn a game from another country this St Patrick's day by playing 'Giant's Causeway!'

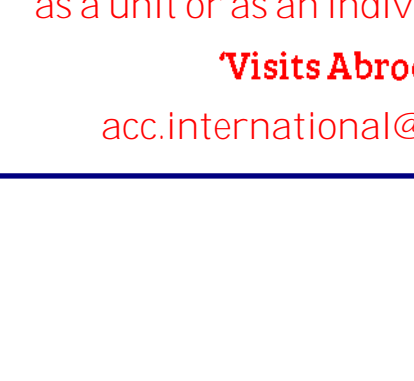
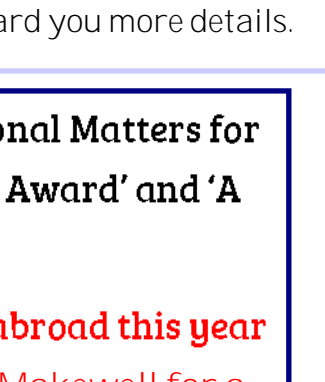
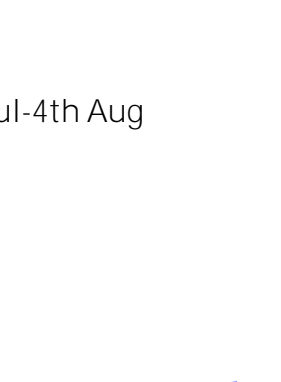
